

Christine (Tina) N. Runyan, Ph.D. is a Clinical Health Psychologist who has been involved with integrated primary care for the past 10 years. Dr. Runyan received her undergraduate degree in Biopsychology from the University of Maryland in 1992. She earned her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology in 1998 from Virginia Tech. In 1999, Dr. Runyan completed a post-doctoral fellowship in clinical health psychology at Wilford Hall Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas. She spent 6 years on active duty in the US Air Force and was the project leader for developing, training providers, and implementing the model of behavioral health integration that is currently used throughout the US Air Force and has served as a model of integrated care for other federal agencies. She has trained numerous behavioral health providers to deliver integrated care as well as worked with organizations – primarily Federally Qualified Health Centers - to develop and implement integrated care programs. She taught health psychology and the integrated healthcare curriculum at Forest Institute of Professional Psychology in Springfield, Missouri where she was instrumental in developing a clinical practicum rotation for FIPP students, leading to the Integrated Health Care Track at FIPP to be highlighted in an *APA Monitor* article in 2007 and was the recipient of the NCSPP Innovation award that same year. She has substantial experience being on the front-lines of clinical integration, working in a clinical capacity to deliver integrated healthcare within various FQHCs and can thus speak to the opportunities and challenges from multiple perspectives. She has written and presented nationally about integrated care and regularly collaborates with other national leaders in the field. In November 2009, she will become the Associate Director of Behavioral Sciences and the Director of the Postdoctoral Primary Care Fellowship at the University of Massachusetts Medical School, Department of Family Medicine and Community Health.
